



K12 FLORIDA L.L.C. ANTI-DISCRIMINATION POLICY

Admission and enrollment policies and procedures related to anti-discrimination for cyber charter schools that K12 Florida L.L.C. provides virtual instruction services to (“Florida Cyber Charter Academy”) are in compliance with Section 1000.05(2)(a), F.S., which prohibits discrimination on the basis of race, ethnicity, religion, age, national origin, gender, disability, or marital status against a student or an employee. *It is the policy of the Florida Cyber Charter Academy that no person be denied admission to the school or be denied participation in, be denied benefits of, or be discriminated against in any curricular, extracurricular, student services, recreational or other program or activities, shall not be abridged or impaired because of the person's sex, race, religion, national origin, ancestry, creed, pregnancy, marital or parental status, sexual orientation or physical, mental, emotional or learning disability as required by state and federal statutes. This policy also prohibits discrimination as defined by Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 (sex), Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (race and national origin) and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (handicap).*
